*Historic Appomattox*

There are many places over the world where an Armistice was signed, or where actual fighting stopped in some war. But Appomattox is one of the few places in all the world where a genuine peace was made. When Generals Robert E. Lee and Ulysses S. Grant made a "gentleman's peace" in the McLean House at Old Appomattox Court House on Palm Sunday, April 9, 1865, it not only ended the War between the States, but cemented America into one mighty nation. We urge you to visit the McLean House and other historic shrines, about one mile north of Parkway Restaurant, on Route 24. The area is administered by the National Park Service, and the restoration will continue, aimed toward completion well before the 100th anniversary of the Peace in 1965.

Parkway Restaurant is midway between the McLean House and the modern Town of Appomattox. Visit both while in Appomattox, and do not forget that in Virginia you will find a happy blending of preservation of what is Past with progress in the Present and Future.
