# Senior Class History



All aboard! All aboard! On September 5, 1957, one hundred-twenty passengers stepped aboard the "Freshmen Express" which was headed toward "Diploma-ville". The engineer was Mr. Christopher. In the first car were the conductors, Mrs. Lawrence, Mr. Bragg, Miss Riemann, and Mr. Le Roux to see that we got off to our destination safely. Everyone was soon advancing toward the completion of the year's work. We also found time to participate in clubs and sports. After nine months of study and hard work we all stopped at "Vacation-ville" where we spent an enjoyable three months.

On September 4, 1958, when we pulled out from "Vacation-ville", we were this time aboard the "Sophomore Express" with Engineer Rush replacing Engineer Christopher. We were assisted by Mrs. Cheatham, Mr. Hudson, Mrs. Taylor, and Mrs. McClenny. Student officers aboard this Express were Larry Torrence, Hunter Tolley, Donald Gurney and Teddy Garrett who were trying their best to lead the class. However, traveling was made easier by gaining knowledge of the many greater heights that we would encounter before we reached our destination. When we stopped at "Sports-ville", six of the boys from the "Sophomore Express" joined the "Rebels" from the Junior and Senior Expresses, to show their football spirit.

In the fall of 1959, the passengers transferred to the "Junior Express" with conductors Mrs. Morris, Miss Holley, Mrs. Bingham, and Mrs. Holland. Junior leaders were Dicky Guill, George Bergdoll, Larry Torrence, and Harold Conner. As an indication of each one's progress, we joyfully received our class rings. From here, we knew that we had only one more year to travel before sighting our destination. In May, 1961, we stopped at "Prom-ville" to entertain the passengers from the "Senior Express". This was our last stop before June, when we again vacationed, before starting on the final lap of our journey.

Eighty-four smiling passengers finally hopped aboard the "Senior Express" in the fall of 1960. At the throttle again was Engineer Rush, assisted by conductors Mrs. Gilbert, Mrs. Beamer, and Mrs. Cheatham. Robert Garrette, Donald Gurney, Eva Moore, Harold Conner, Faye Martin, and Robbie Lou Robertson faithfully took a big part in leading us through our year's accomplishments. Our main project for the year was the contribution at Christmas of a car full of gifts to a needy family. As a special side light of our senior activities, the "Absent-Minded Bridegroom" was performed by our able actors and actresses. The caboose overflowing with money proved that our play was a sensational hit. We are looking forward to a prom this year, given to us by the "Junior Express", at "Dreams-ville". Many will also take a detour in April, by way of New York, on a special "Rail-Hound". We can hardly believe that we are aboard the last Express with Mr. Rush getting ready our passports for all future journeys that we wish to undertake. Although we are almost at the end of this part of our journey, we realize that we have just begun to travel on routes that will lead to various achievements.
