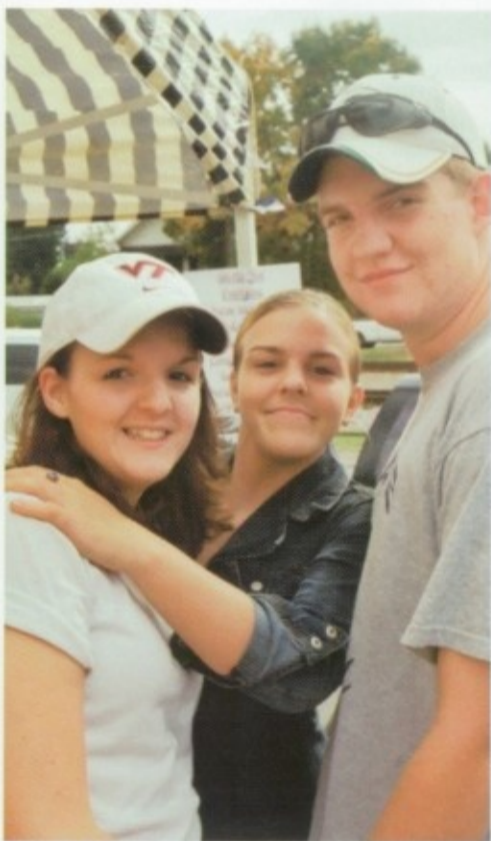

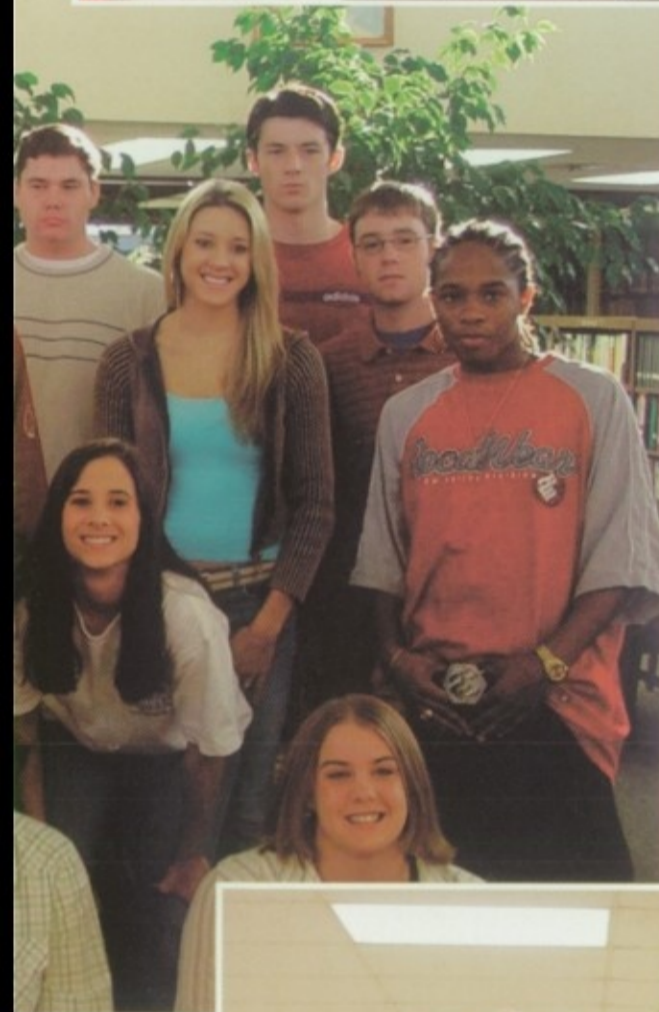


DAYDREAM BELIEVERS

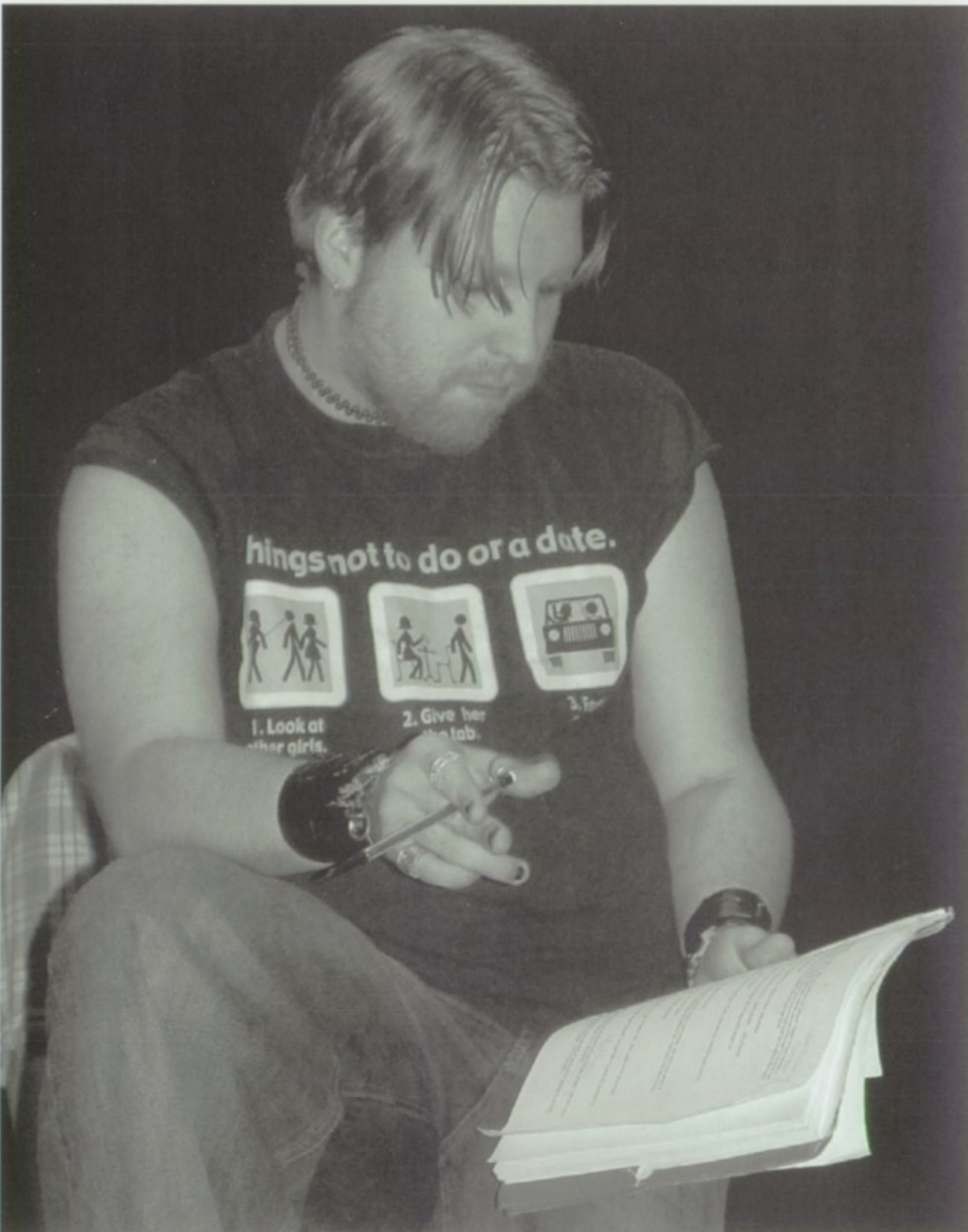

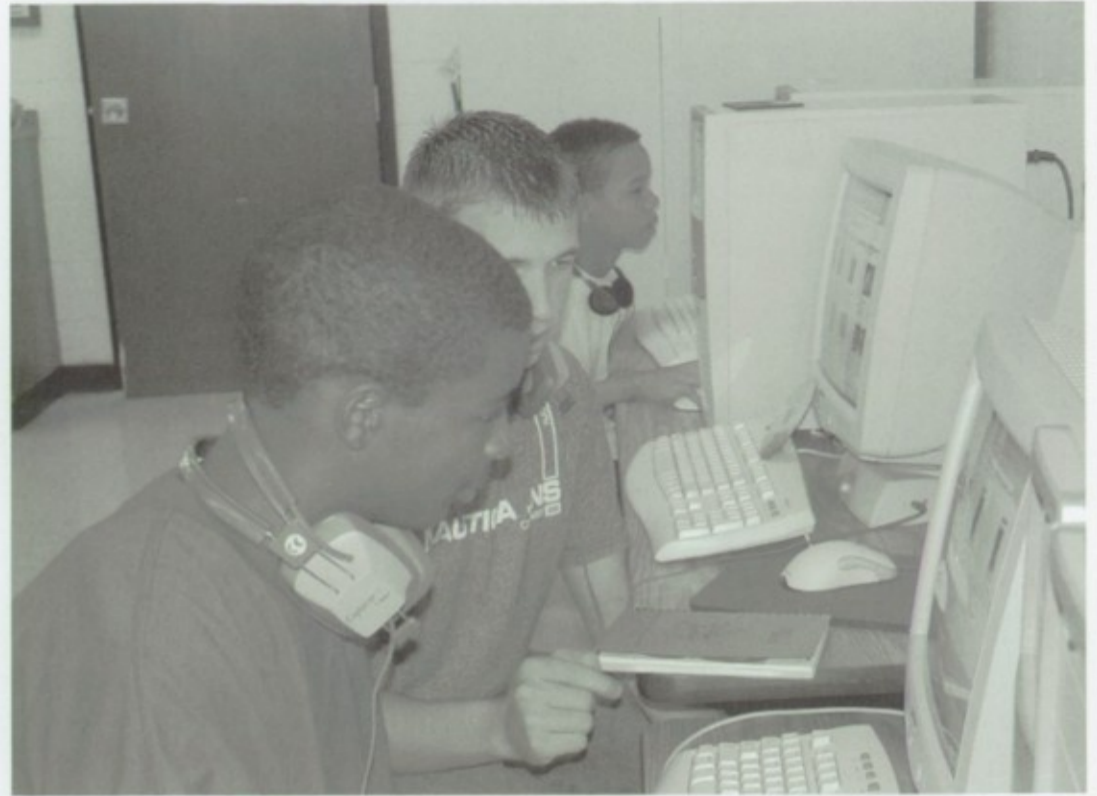

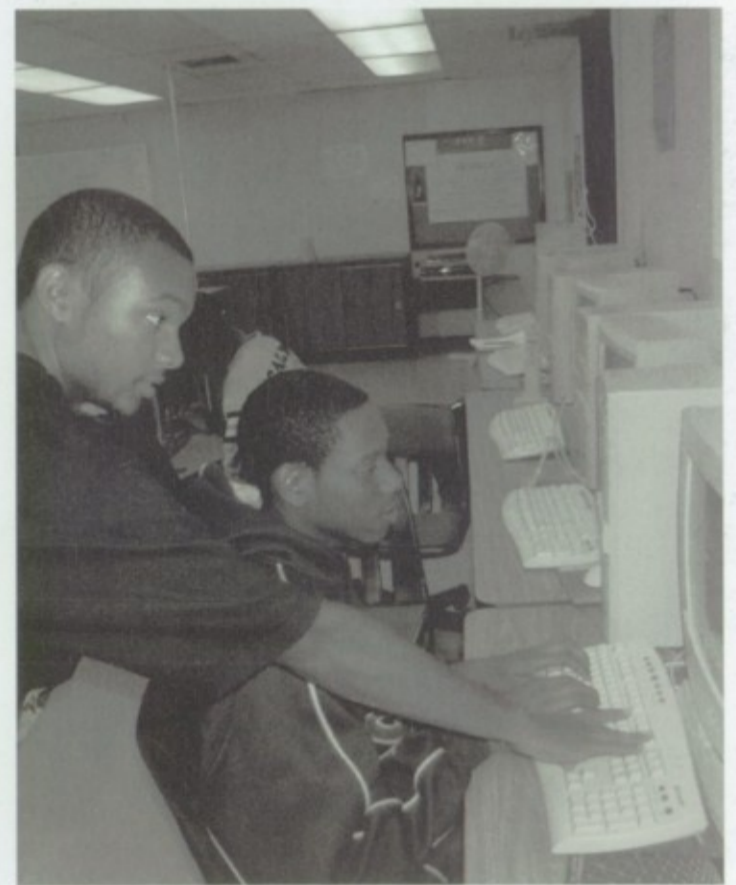

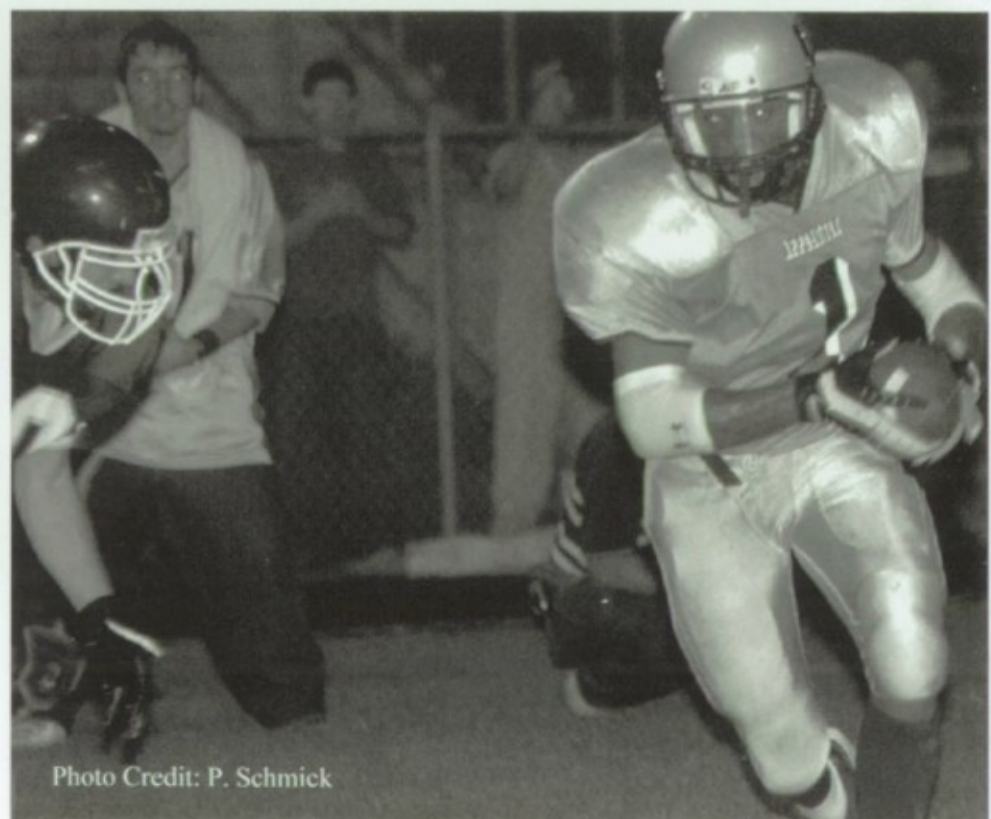

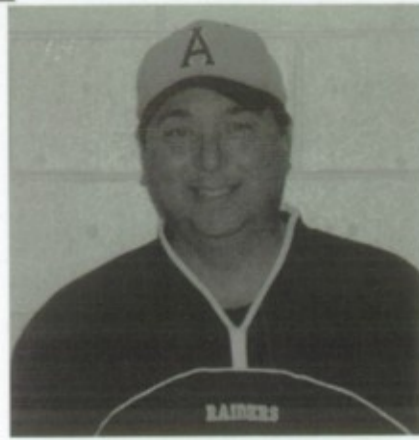

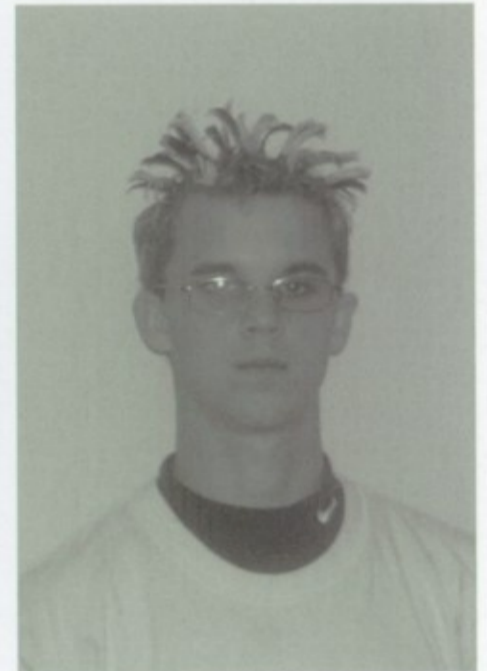

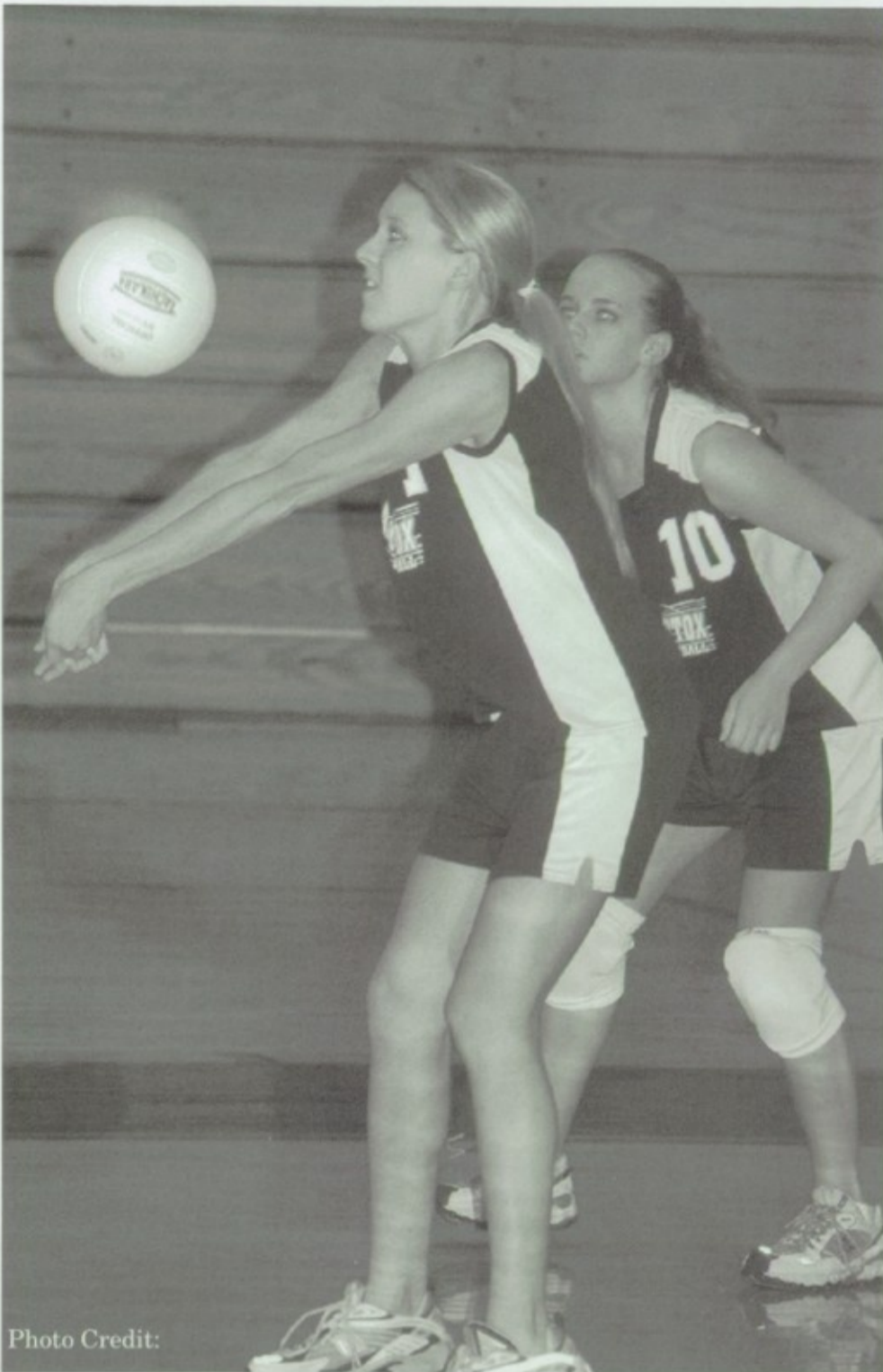

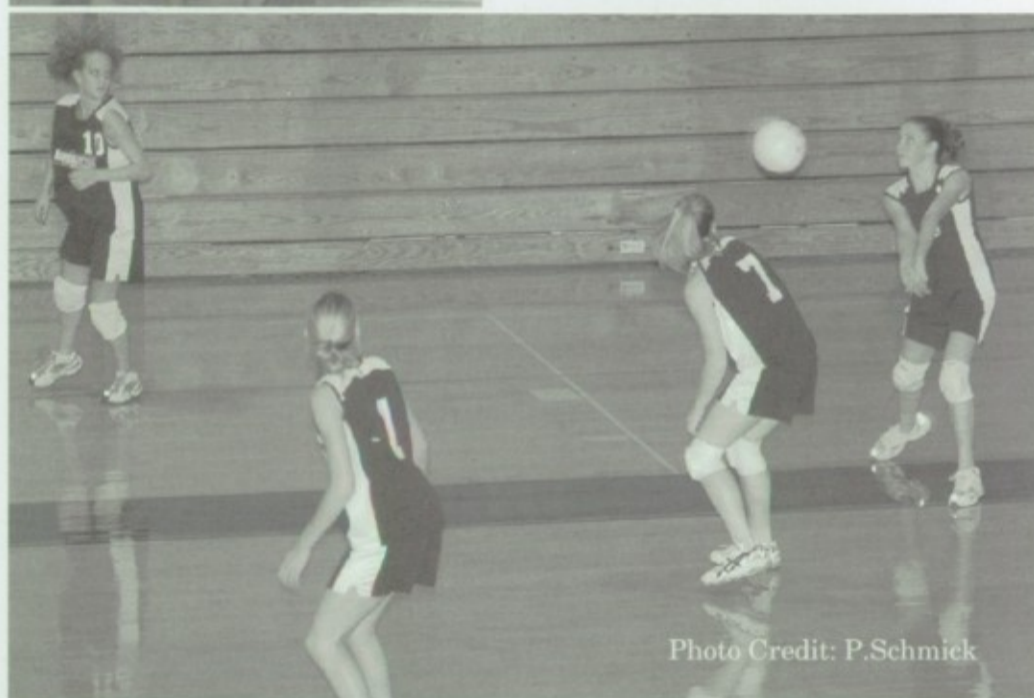

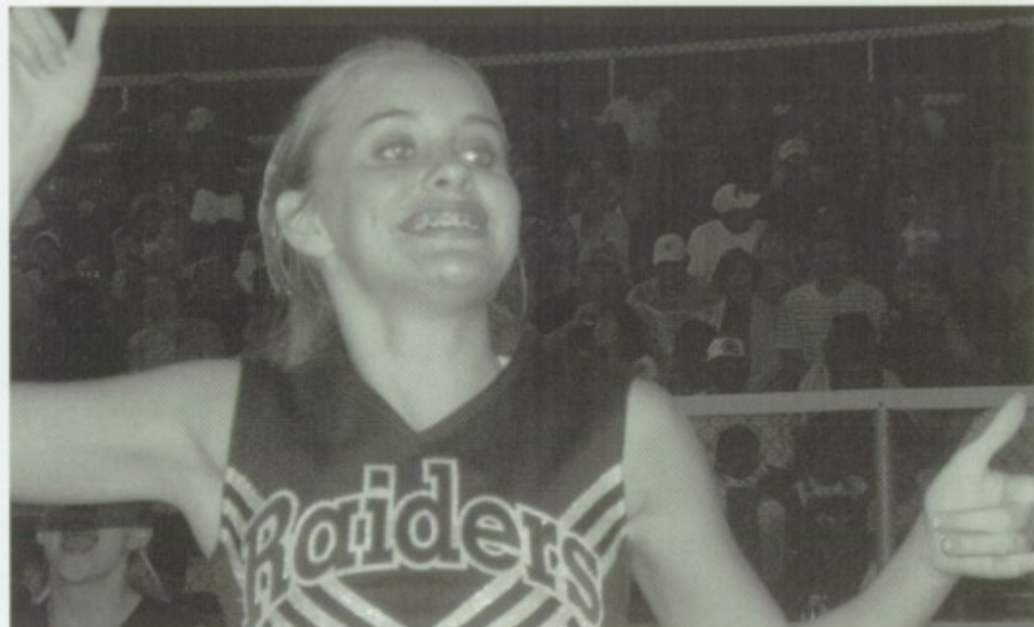
Varsity Football Cheerleading

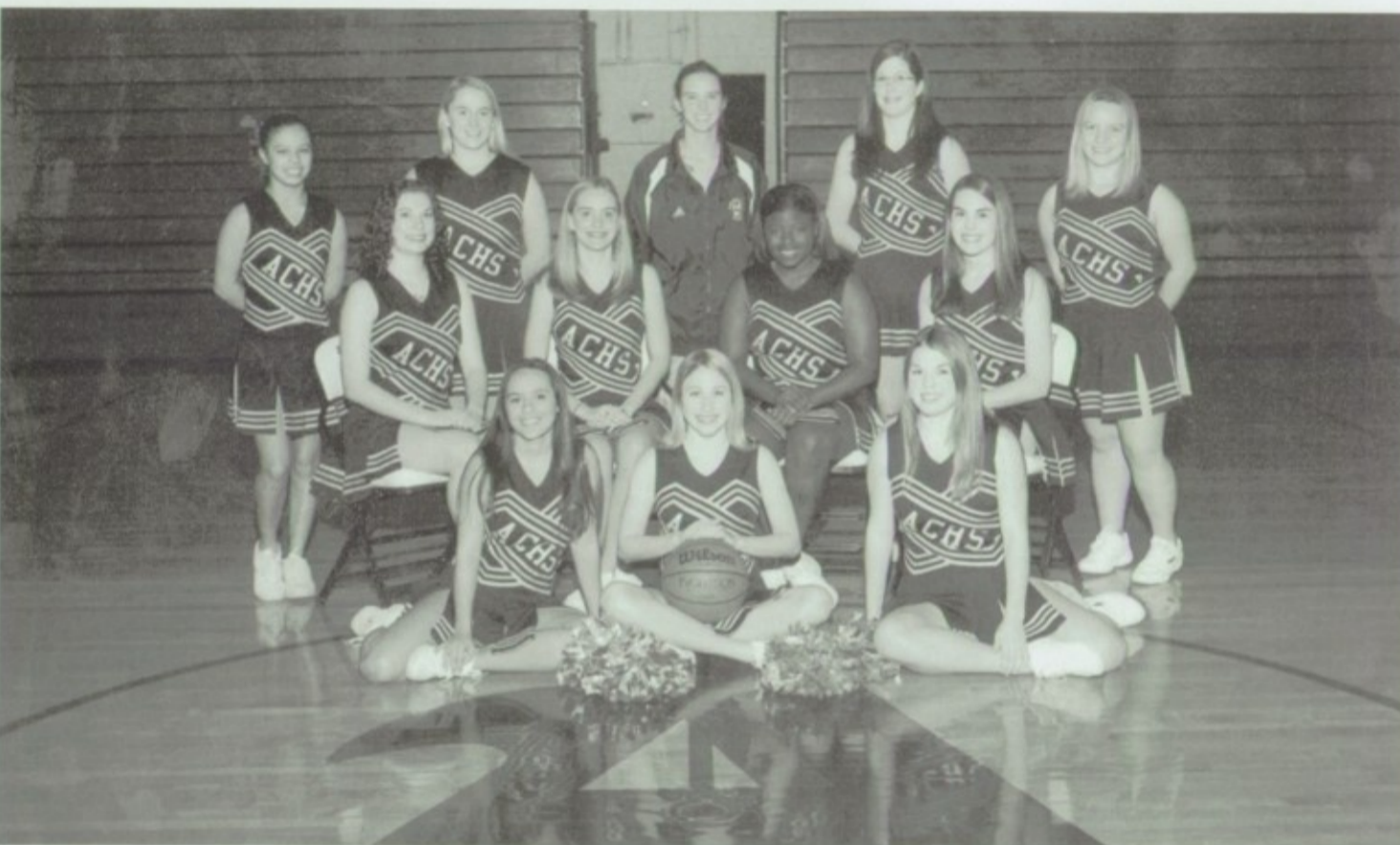

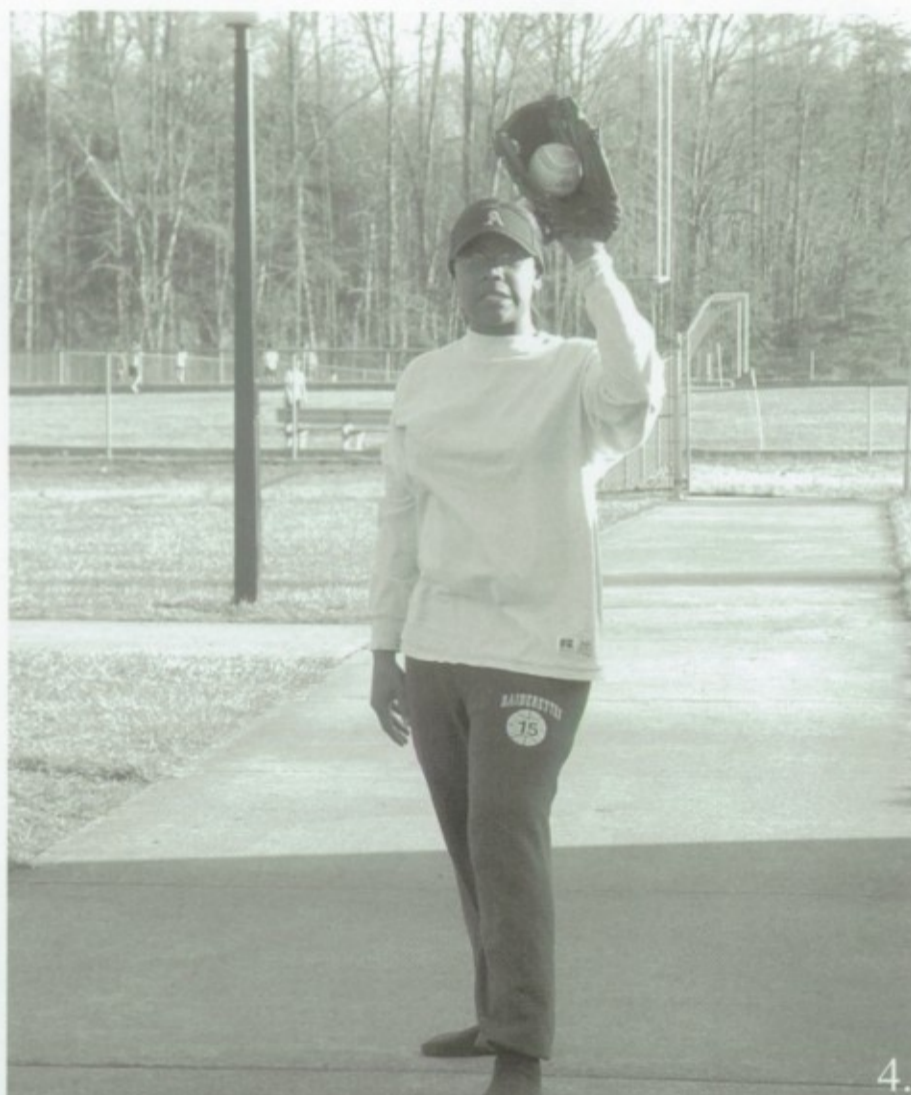
