

1. SUBJECT:

Old Book Rack.

2. LOCATION:

In possession of Richard A. Anderson, Appomattox, Virginia R. F.D. 5.5 miles north of Appomattox, Virginia on Route #24; thence 1.9 miles west on Route #616; thence 600 yards north on private road leading to the house.

3. DATE OR PERIOD:

1790.

4. OWNERS:

John Bocoock	1790
Edward Lawrence Anderson	1870
Richard A. Anderson	1903 to present date.

5. DESCRIPTION:

Possibly this was called a book case at the time John Bocoock came into possession of it, today it would be called a what-not. The wood looks to be of mahogany. Three lower shelves are of the same length but the three upper shelves vary in length. Turn spindles are used as supports. (See drawing attached to the original report.)

6. HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE:

This book rack has been in the same family since 1790, handed down from one descendant to another.
