As usual we people in Charlotte want you to help us. The four miles of road from the Courthouse to a point near Drakes Branch which, ~~xxxxxx~~ through your good offices, was made part of the Highway System, has been graded and is now being maintained by the Commission. We are all extremely anxious to have the Commission put gravel and tar on this road before the bad weather sets in. As you probably realize, this road is the main artery from the upper part of Charlotte and from parts of Prince Edward and Appomattox over which the farmers take their tobacco to Drakes Branch. It will have to bear a tremendous traffic during the bad weather, and it would be a great thing for us if we could only get gravel and tar put on it before Winter sets in. As you know Drakes is on the Southern, so that the haul of the gravel would be easy.

Of you can use your persuasive powers on Mr. Shirley and get him to do this for us, it would be a great thing for Charlotte.
