My dear Senator:

You will recall that in August 1926 I paid for some repairs for an artificial limb for Linwood Godsey. He was in the office this morning asking that we furnish him a new limb.

Examination shows that the old limb is broken down to such an extent that repairs are now impossible.

I was in Appomattox some time last year and was informed by some of the citizens that this young man's family was sufficiently well off to supply him with the artificial limb. I have requested him to see you and have you write me in regard to the matter. If in your judgment, the young man's father is not able to pay all or for any part of the artificial limb and you think it a worthy case and one that should be helped, please write me and I will take it up with my Board and see what can be done. At the present time, acting on instructions from the Board, we are not taking on any new cases, but if you think this case should be helped, a letter from you to that effect would probably enable me to get my Board to authorize it. However, if the young man's family is able to take care of it, please so advise.
