Dear Mr. Ferguson:


As you know the Regional Road Conference meets in Farmville tomorrow at one o'clock, and I am expecting you of course. You and your Board of Supervisors are to be guests of the Supervisors and the Lions Club here at lunch at twelve o'clock. Also the Clerk and Commonwealth's Attorney, all of whom no doubt have received invitations. Of course the general public is expected to attend the meeting at one o'clock in the State Teachers College auditorium and we are looking for some six or seven hundred people, but the guests at the luncheon will be the Supervisors, members of the Legislature, Commonwealth Attorneys, Clerks, etc., from the twenty-three counties represented in this conference.

As you know this meeting is called by the Governor for the purpose of closer co-operation between the local road authorities and the Highway Commission and is not for the purpose of making allocations. I would like to have your opinion though as to the propriety of getting the Governor and the Commission to give us, say, twenty minutes, to present the matter of the completion of Route 10. We could only do this by special permission because the Governor and the Commission have their own program and it is more for local affairs than anything else.

If you get in town in time tomorrow hope you will come by the office so that we can have a little conference.
