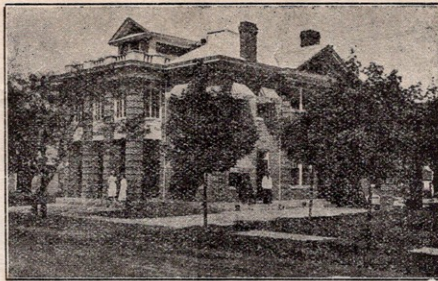

Dear Senator Ferguson:

You recall that sometime ago in Richmond I asked you to look after my Committee appointments for me. You will also recall that we discussed the successor to Governor Byrd on the Steering Committee.

I understand there is considerable controversy among some of the members as to these Committee appointments, and I also understand that some of them suggested that I was asking for too much. The fact is I have not asked for anything. Several others have discussed Committee appointments with me but you are the only person that I have asked to look out for me in this matter and then I was not specific as to appointments. In view of those circumstances I cannot see how they could think that I was asking for too much.

I only want what is just and fair and only such appointments where I can render a service, but I do expect my friends to help me get myself in a position to render a service which will make it worth while for me to spend my time in Richmond these two months.

The situation as to the general Committee appointments for the three new members appears to me in this way. It seems that some of the old members are rushing in to get the best Committee assignments held by the three retiring members, and of course expect to give up some minor assignment in place of them. This will leave practically nothing for the new men.

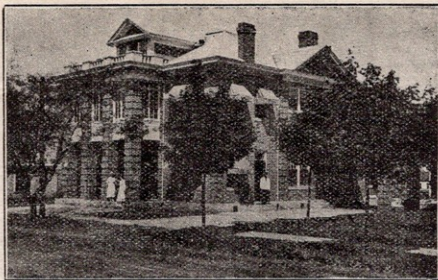
