Dear Sam:-

I promised you that I would look after young Garrett and I have done so. When I got up to Lexington Saturday morning I immediately inquired if he were entered and at the Institute and found that he was. I then looked to see if he had received an appointment as State Cadet but found that the first five alternates had received appointments and he was number seven. Of course he would have gotten his appointment in a little while, but there was a vacancy in the Chas. J. Anderson Scholarships, of which there are six to be appointed from the different geographical divisions of the state and as all of the other divisions had one except south-side I got the Board at its meeting Saturday night to give him this appointment. A State Cadetship saves \$270.00 a year but with the obligation to teach two years after graduation or serve a term of enlistment in the National G Guard or a term with the State Highway Department, while the Anderson Scholarship carries with it \$250.00 a year and no obligation to teach or pay back the money. With the possibility that he might not be reached as an alternate and with the certainty of this appointment I thought it better to cinch it. I was delighted to be able to render Bob a service for he has had my sympathy throughout his entire trouble.

I dropped off here yesterday afternoon and am taking the noon train for Richmond.
